



Is it me, or is it the medicine?

Two people can take the same dose and get on with it very differently. A cheek swab can indicate how quickly your body is likely to process certain medicines — one piece of information your prescriber can weigh alongside your other medicines and the rest of your history. It does not say whether a medicine will work for you.

- One swab from the inside of your cheek; a routine blood panel can be drawn at the same visit.
- The result is a likely pattern, not a measurement of the medicine you are taking now.
- Whether either test is right for you is your prescriber's call.
