



Does cancer run in your family?

A cheek swab can look for inherited gene variants linked to certain cancers. Finding one does not mean you have cancer; finding none does not rule it out, because most cancers are not inherited. This practice also offers a stool-based screen, which indicates whether further tests are needed rather than giving an answer on its own.

- Cancer Screening CGX: a cheek swab, no blood draw. It reads inherited risk, not what is happening now.
- Cancer Detection Stool: a sample collected at home, read in a lab. A screen that flags whether follow-up is needed.
- Neither result is a diagnosis, and neither rules cancer out. Whether either test fits your history is your doctor's call, not something to settle from a poster.
