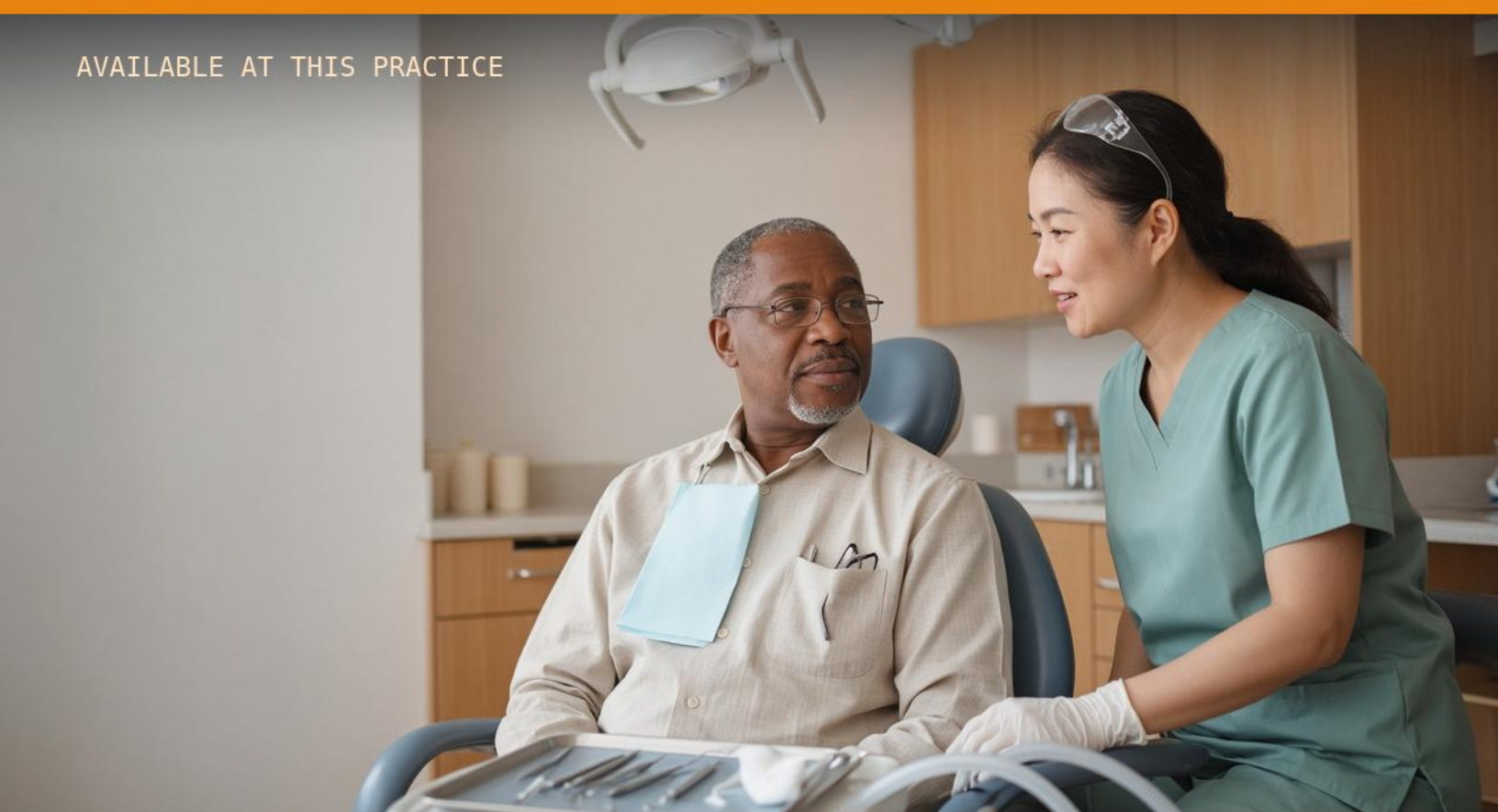
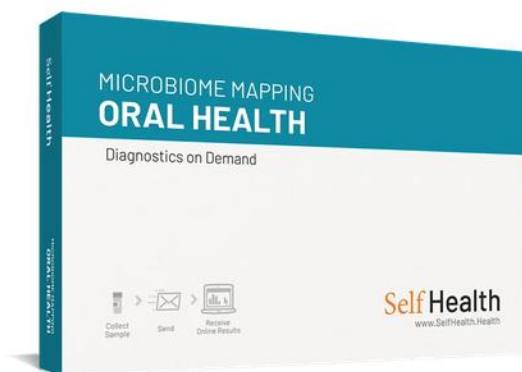




A cleaning removes plaque. A swab names it.

A swab taken at the same visit reports twenty organisms from your mouth, including the three long associated with gum disease, plus your salivary pH. It gives names and amounts. It is not a diagnosis and it does not explain a symptom on its own — gum disease is diagnosed by your dentist, from the exam and the X-rays.

- A swab during a visit you have already booked. No needle, no second appointment.
- Pharmacogenetics is a separate swab: how your body processes medicines such as codeine — one input among several into what your dentist prescribes after treatment.
- Whether either panel makes sense for you is your dentist's call, not this poster's.
