Has anyone checked your hormones?

A routine physical usually covers a metabolic panel, a blood count and lipids. A full hormone panel is not normally part of it. Here, all of that comes from one morning draw, and a separate cheek swab reports gene variants associated with how you process certain medicines.

- One venous draw covers the blood results. The gene sample is a cheek swab, not a second needle, and it comes back separately and later.
- The swab describes how you may process certain medicines. It does not say whether a medicine will work, or what to take.
- Neither panel diagnoses anything, and whether either one is useful for you is your clinician's call, not ours.
